It is expected that they will collaborate and present a unified overture for Classis Heartland's consideration at a future meeting, with a view to having this considered by Synod 2022.

Ireton CRC also submitted a series of overtures addressing concerns regarding ministry shares, pledging for ministry shares, and formal statements from denominational leaders on behalf of the CRCNA, addressing current social issues. After some discussion by classis, the Ireton CRC delegation withdrew their overtures.
